PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools

Since September 2014 the Government has provided additional funding direct to primary schools to support the provision of high quality PE and School Sport. Each school receives £8000 plus an extra £5 for each pupil in Years 1 to 6. Initially, this was to be for 3 academic years, however the Government has announced that this is to be extended to 2020 and be worth £750 million. From September 2017 this budget has been doubled to £16,000 plus an extra £10 per child from year 1 to 6.
